Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) covers many types of actions from low-level persistent nuisance to serious public disturbance and is behaviour that:

- is capable of causing nuisance and annoyance
- is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress
- creates significant and persistent problems in the neighbourhood
- Leaves communities intimidated and afraid.

Examples of such behaviour would include: noise, harassment, vandalism, graffiti and fly tipping, nuisance neighbours, street drinking, intimidation and threats, violence and hate behaviour that targets members of identified groups because of their perceived differences.

How do I report ASB?

- Report it via the Norfolk Police website at <https://www.norfolk.police.uk/contact-us/6-report-it/08-anti-social-behaviour>
- Contact Norfolk Police by calling **101**.
- Contact your local District Council.
- Social housing tenants can report the problem to their Housing Officer.

In an emergency always call the police on **999**.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

During December an operational plan was put in place to manage the night time economy and to support licensees over Christmas and the New Year. This had a positive impact with very few issues encountered over the busy period. There was also a decrease in the usual shoplifting incidents for the same period as a result with our engagement with the supermarkets in Fakenham. PC Dawson would like to issue another reminder too, with the colder weather approaching please make sure you have taken the necessary security measures to protect your stores of heating oil.

As we embark on a new year the regular engagement events start to open up again. If there are any groups that would like to hold an engagement event over a coffee or with a specific issue in mind please don't hesitate to get in touch via the SNT email. For example, in February PC Dawson will be involved in a joint Safeguarding event with local schools, coffee mornings, a local bereavement group have asked if PC Dawson will do an input on a relevant subject for them and the monthly Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel meeting takes place on 3rd at 7pm. This will again be held via Microsoft Teams so if you have any burning issues you would like to be considered by the panel and would like an invite to attend please get in contact.

It helps officers understand and patrol the more vulnerable areas and helps inform relevant authorities so the area can be made to feel safer.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st December)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	1	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	4	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	6	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	7	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	1	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
