WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Over the past 3 months Fakenham Safer Neighbourhood Team has been focussing on anti-social behaviour specifically around Millennium Park, Church Lanes and Gardens and Aldiss Park. PC Dawson has also been responding to complaints about speeding in the town.

As a result of working in partnership with Fakenham Town Council, the tree line in Millennium Park has been raised and ongoing work is nearing completion for a CCTV camera to be installed for public reassurance during the evenings.

Going forward the team will be continuing to look at the potential issues of anti-social behaviour in the same locations and working towards resolving a vehicle anti-social behaviour issue on Oak Street in Fakenham.

PC Dawson will continue to have a presence in the Market Place on market days and will be increasing support to the Academy through lesson inputs and pastoral support.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st March)

| Offence | Numbers | What could this entail |
|---|---------|--|
| Arson | 1 | Damage caused as a result of fire. |
| Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) | 2 | Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident. |
| Burglary business and community | 0 | A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in. |
| Burglary residential | 1 | Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in. |
| Criminal Damage | 7 | A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else. |
| Domestic | 6 | Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality. |
| Hate Incident | 0 | Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender. |
| Race or Religious aggravated public fear | 0 | Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above. |
| Possession of controlled substance | 3 | Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C. |
| Possession of weapons | 0 | Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon. |
| Public fear, alarm or distress | 9 | Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence. |
| Robbery | 0 | Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear. |
| Theft from a motor vehicle | 1 | Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle. |
| Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle | 3 | Any motor vehicle including those abandoned. |
| Theft of pedal cycle | 0 | From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD. |
| Theft from a person | 0 | Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket. |
