We held the Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel (SNAP) Priority Setting Meeting for Fakenham and surrounding parishes yesterday (Wednesday 10th November) via Microsoft Teams. Updates were given on previous priorities and two new priorities were voted in by the panel.

The new priorities are:

1. To assist in the prevention of criminal damage and anti-social behaviour at the Three Brick Arches in Fakenham.
2. To deter anti-social behaviour and incidents relating to the Night Time Economy in Fakenham and the Raynhams over the festive period.

CURRENT NEIGHBOURHOOD PRIORITIES

- To assist in the prevention of criminal damage and anti-social behaviour at the Three Brick Arches in Fakenham
- To deter anti-social behaviour and incidents relating to the Night Time Economy in Fakenham and the Raynhams over the festive period.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

During October PC Dawson was heavily involved in multi-agency working to safeguard a vulnerable adult male and two teenage boys. This was in addition to the work which continues at Fakenham Academy on a weekly basis with the new leadership team.

Face to face engagement opportunities have started to open up with regular surgeries at Swanton Novers and Fakenham Market. During October the local Inspector and PC Dawson attended the annual Fakenham town assembly giving local residents the chance to ask questions and be updated on what has been achieved in the past year and what's coming in the year ahead.

PC Dawson met with residents of Fulmodeston and Barney to discuss traffic issues in the villages. The parishes are now considering starting up the Community Speedwatch group again and have a further meeting with NCC Highways dept to discuss possible improvements to the road markings and signage.

On Wednesday 10th November we held our SNAP meeting via Teams where new priorities were chosen (see Neighbourhood Priorities below).

Retailers in Fakenham are trying to rekindle the Chamber of Trade group and have their first meeting on 17th November which PC Dawson will be attending. There are also several parish council meetings, the Christmas Lights event and the Christmas Tree Festival at the end of the month.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st October)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	1	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	10	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	9	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	1	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	5	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	4	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	1	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	1	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	1	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
